Athletic Director's Report: Pat DeCamillis

- Fall results: Cross Country girls placed 13th as a team, Cloe Ruth 7th overall; Boys Soccer 11-6, league runner up; Softball 11-14, qualified for regionals; Volleyball 11-12; Football 4-6; Spirit conference champs, qualified for nationals.
- Unified Bowling still going, regionals this week 5 kids going to regionals, State on Nov 18 Centennial Lanes in Englewood
- Wednesday, 11/9/22, is signing day -6 female student-athletes, Allie H, Rachel M, Megan K, Talyn, Grace, and Izzy.

Principal's Report: Erick Finnestead

- Facilities: The turf for the field was approved and will include reconstruction of the track, will be 1 field for both soccer and football to use. Ed Foundation will replace the sign on Nelson to be a new LED sign. Have paid the city, now waiting, to make improvements to Grandview.
- A huge amount of collaboration is happening between the community and the classrooms. Ball
 Aerospace engineers in astronomy classes, Colorado attorneys doing a mock trial with 11th grade,
 Oceans First outreach satellite in Boulder studying microplastics, reviewing of CEMEX plant,
- Music department: Unified percussion had its first concert. Working the feeder school partnerships and have concerts planned for 8th and 5th graders. The marching band grew by 20 students this year. Band night was well attended and all the support was appreciated.
- SCHS is seen as a model school for helping at-risk students. Efforts of home visits, tutoring, outreach, and more are getting good results. Attendance overall is 93%, lowest failure rate in English and math across SVVSD
- 33 clubs and organizations are active at that school
- Prom: Prom will be on April 29th at Asterisk in Denver. Planning on 500-600 kids to attend with a budget
 of \$10k, options for locations are limited. The location was the best choice to be cost-effective, private,
 self-contained, safe, and available parking. Date was selected to avoid Mothers Day, Easter, and test
