Principals Report- Mr. Finnestead

Academics and Initiatives

280 students participated in the Fall PSAT/NMSQT achieving a median score of 1053, with students achieving a median score 548.5 in English and 504.5 in Math. Amongst large schools, Silver Creek outperformed every other SVVSD school.

Silver Creek has 480 students taking 992 AP courses. 38% of students are taking an Advanced Placement course.

Silver Creek has implemented the Eco-Cycle Green Star Schools Program and has created composting alternatives to waste reduction.

Silver Creek has 962 students taking an Honors and/or an Advanced Placement class. 76% of Silver Creek students are taking an Honors or Advanced Placement course.

Senior Adithya Bhaskara is a National Merit Semifinalist.

62 Students will recover credit in ECredit Classes.

Silver Creek has 30 clubs this Fall, which have been well attended.

Silver Creek hosts Padres Unidos linking parents to the high school experience of their children.

Implementation of the AAA program and Drop-In Tutoring in Math, English, Science and Spanish - students learning and applying academic skills resulting in fewer missed assignments and substantial grade improvements for most attendees.

64 new students joined the Silver Creek National Honors Society in the Fall of 2021.

Co-Taught classes have been implemented in all core subject areas in the 9-11 grades, with English extending 9-12 grades.

Professional development has been provided in areas of equitable grading, working with IEP students, using student reflection as a tool for writing, safety and security, common assessments, new curriculum in English, Cultural Awareness in the School, MTSS Process, Student Identification of Academic Support and Interventions, Cybersecurity, Green Star Schools, School Goals around access to advanced classes and graduation rates.

4 Students have been named as Boettcher Scholar Semi Finalists - Adithya Bhaskara, Gracie Zhang and Sudhiksha Sivakumar. Savannah Rohrer

Ashly Gacetta has been named as a Heisman Scholar and will compete in additional rounds.

Development of Heritage Speakers Spanish class to be implemented in 22-23 in an effort to create accelerated pathways to Advanced Placement and Seal of Bi-Literacy for native Spanish speakers.

Development of Lifeguarding class to be implemented semester 2 2021-2022.

All School art show featuring hundreds of pieces of work on display throughout Silver Creek.

Celebration of CSEdWeek at Silver Creek. Students participated in the hour of code and explored compassionate ways to use code to positively impact their communities.

Silver Creek has over 90% of students participating in Advanced Placement courses registered for exams, reaching the greatest percentage amongst SVVSD high school students.

Silver Creek has hosted two Cafecitos (Padres Unidos) meetings for our Hispanic parents to gain greater access within their childrens' school. Topics have included Infinite Campus, Schoology, Registration, COVID and co-curriculars.

Fundraising Projects - SCOPA has contributed \$100,000 towards the educational and performance experience of 100 students attending Disney Performing Arts Trip. Silver Creek Education Foundation is working to contribute approximately \$30,000 to replace the LED sign at Silver Creek.

Ollin LatinX Leadership Club developed to positively engage LatinX youth in opportunities to enrich their school and community, while finding success in academics.

Silver Creek Leadership Academy (SCLA)- Carrie

- SCLA students volunteered 5732 hours in 2021
- 42 students completing senior Capstone Projects
- 75 students attended the fall SCLA retreat held at SCHS this year due to Covid Restrictions
- Capstone Project highlights:
 - \$500 raised to provide eye surgery for a young girl in Ghana allowing her to continue her education.
 - \$2375 raised from a student-led concert that went to Nepal, providing funds to teachers who've gone without pay for two years during the pandemic.
 - Throughout the year, all nurses at Longmont United Hospital will be provided a goodie thank you bag for their efforts during the pandemic.
 - o 60 students did clean up work at the Colorado Therapeutic Riding Center
 - SCLA students teaching STEM classes at Columbine Elementary and Westview Middle School.
 - SCLA senior intern with the Safe Shelter of Longmont provided a workshop on teen dating violence and consent to all first semester 9th grade Health Class students.
 - 20 volunteers cleaned and repainted the dugouts at the ballfields for Niwot Youth Sports.
 - SCLA Seniors took the lead in coaching Unified Bowling and organized the Police VS students bowling tournament. They are busy setting up Unified basketball.
 - Upperclassmen taught 60 freshman monthly growth mindset lessons.
 - Two self defense and woman empowerment classes were held at SCHS and taught by a professional MMA fighter.
 - Students are working to upcycle clothing and provide needed clothing for students at a local middle school.

- Jeans are being collected to be recycled into insulation for houses.
- Over 300 shoes have been collected to go to Soles 4 Souls.
- Fundraising efforts are happening for water projects in the Dominican Republic, The National Eating Disorder Association, The Make A Wish Foundation, H.O.P.E of Longmont, and The El Nino Rey Project providing dental care for a community in Mexico
- Beds are being created for the large animals at the Wild Animal Sanctuary
- Entrepreneurial Classes for Latino Women are being taught by SCLA student.
- Healthy Eating Classes are being taught at Altona Middle School
- Jazz Improv classes are being offered to area middle school students with concerts coming to showcase their learning.
- Outdoor education classes and activities is being provided to the Boulder County I Have A Dream Foundation
- Internships at local Veterinary clinics
- Building needed items for the Greenwood wildlife Rehabilitation Center
- Karate Classes focusing on developing leadership skills and a growth mindset are being taught at APEX homeschool program
- Partnering with the SVVSD to host Day of Champions Field Day in May
- Raptor Report- focusing on showcasing all the SCHS activities
- Raptor TV- providing video productions of sporting events, concerts and other activities at SCHS.
- Over 300 students given a workshop on screen addiction
- Sources of Strength Program had fall training and several events to support mental health at SCHS

 - o 800 goodie bags made for the Meals on Wheels Organisation
 - 10 boxes of school supplies, arts and crafts and books were collected and donated to the Wild Plum Center
 - Students provided Spanish Tutoring help during the fall semester

 - Juniors hosted the Ugly Sweater Fun Run raising \$1000 for future Capstone Projects
 - Community Leadership Students worked with students at Eagle Crest teaching exercise and fun brain breaks
 - Students hosted the NOVIA Ski Movie, a movie about girls in sports created by an SCHS Alum
 - Students created thousands of leaves with positive messages hung in the library
 - Freshmen hosted the first annual Rock, Paper, Scissors World Championships
