General Fund Request

- We have \$3,300 to Grant out and we have three fund requests.
- Track is requesting \$2,649 for the Timing System. It is Bluetooth and it connects right to the coach's phone or iPad. Football and baseball can also use this as well as CrossCountry. She wants eight so that every lane can have one. There is only one company that sells this. Track has 120 students and they have nine partners. Trax fundraisers are having a pancake breakfast on March 14th. They will also have a silent auction and this event is from 8 to 11 in the Commons. Jacy also participated in Dancing with the Silver Creek Stars.
- Girls tennis is requesting \$228 for a camera fence mount and ball Hopper. This will be good for both girls and boys tennis and it should last five plus years. They have \$886 in the RABC account and they also got \$400 from the district and that went towards new tennis balls. They are using the RABC funds for the girls to go hit once a week indoors due to the bad weather. Girls tennis will be doing Fan Angel fundraiser and also a JV tournament on April 21. Sara also did Dancing with the Silver Creek Stars.
- Dance is requesting \$1,200 for uniform. Dance does not need any equipment and you do not pay a registration fee for dance or cheer because they do not need transportation. The uniforms are six years old. Normally they cost between 200 to \$300. They found a new company that gave her a better deal. The parents usually pay for camp and it's

between 400 and \$500 per girl. She would like to save the parents some money because it would cost an extra \$300 for the parents to buy uniforms. The new uniforms will last 2 - 3 years. Dance has 3 partners. Dance did 4 food nights, butter braids and sold bracelets for their fundraisers and the coach also did Dancing with the Silver Creek Stars and they also did a mini-camp which they charge \$50 per kid. March 14th at 7 p.m. they will have a showcase at Silver Creek. It is \$10 for adults and \$6 for students and kids.

- Kaydene added that Uniforms are a hard thing for the RABC to cover because they are usually expensive.
- We had some discussion on the request. The one that has the biggest question mark is dance. We wanted an estimation on how much parents pay for dance. Parents are paying \$1,000 from their own pocket per girl. Cheer cost the parents \$1000- 3,000 per year. For all 3 requests the total amount is \$4,077.00. We only had \$3300.00 to give away but in November at the general request meeting we only gave football \$1500.00. Everyone decided to take some of that money we had left over and up the amount this one time so we could give all 3 teams what they were asking for.
- We are voting for The General Fund request the total amount will be \$4,077.00. All were in favor so it passed.

Guest Speaker Heather Stenner

Heather's Stenner is here to talk to us tonight. She has some awesome ideas and she is here to help us change things up. The administration does a good job of describing what the RABC is but it's usually a brief message we need to have more consistency. Heather was also talking about how all the sports should have their own email for the Parent rep that gets passed down each year. The parent reps should not be using their personal email address. She will be willing to create emails for all the different sports. Parent reps should be using a Google drive that way everything is in one spot whenever you transition over to another person they can just go back and look at everything. She made a new flyer that she passed out to everyone at the meeting And she would be willing to make one for every sport and activity there would be no date on it so the parent reps would never have to change anything and it could be used year after year. Heather is passionate because she wants a system.
